I personally apologize to each and every member who has been impacted by the failure of Caribou Mountain Homes to deliver the 10 homes in Fox Lake on time. This is extremely disappointing, and I can't imagine the undue hardship and disruption this has caused to the families who were

anxiously awaiting the targeted possession date. For this, I personally take responsibility and extend my most sincere and humble apologies. As CEO of the Corporation, the buck stops with me and I want to assure you that we have taken every possible action to get your home completed.

We also apologize to the leadership, as Chief and Council have been made aware of our challenges to deliver this project on time. We were given the opportunity to retain the benefits of building 10 homes by your own company that is community owned with an effort to retain as many local benefits of employment as possible. We have let down the community with this unfortunate delay that has a real and lasting impact to the families awaiting their homes.

We don't want to make excuses for this project not being completed on time, although we encountered many challenges; including some that were unforeseen. However, we accept the responsibility that we should have taken more decisive action to remedy the delays that were occurring. I have personally taken over the project and you have my commitment that these homes will be completed and turned over to the families in a high-quality state as soon as it is feasible.

I am also prepared to meet with any Nation members who are waiting on one of the homes that we are building should you want to discuss this further. I am committed to make this right and have also committed to the Chief and Council to rectify the issues.

"What work do we have coming up?"

Answer:

- Oak Bay, BC Storm/sanitary sewer installation Rogers Fiber Optic installation Telus/Shared Tower Fiber Optic installation projects (2) Southern Alberta
- Ledcor Fiber Optics project Northern Alberta Canadian Fiber Optics Project Northern Alberta

"Do Nation Members Need a lot of **Experience to work for construction?**

Answer:

- Nation members having prior experience/ skills for the position they are applying for always makes their application/selection stronger.
- The most important requirements to work for CMC are to be reliable, willing to be trained and open to guidance.
- All employees have the potential for advancement based on their performance

"Are Safety Courses Required Prior To Working?"

Answer:

- Yes, there are some safety courses required to work within all Divisions of the Corporation.
- Any safety related course training is provided by the company as part of our new employee Orientation.
- If specialized training is required for a project it will be provided to the employee at no cost to them

"Why Are There Not More Nation Supervisors?"

Answer:

- Many supervisory positions require significant experience in more than one specific area as every project usually has multiple trade aspects
- Some aspects of site supervision require knowledge of specific trades such as mechanical or electrical where certification may be necessary
- Experience is gained through long-term employment commitment and through trade school accreditation
- Supervisor positions are advertised and all FN members that meet the qualifications are encouraged to apply.
- Employee advancement is based on performance

Big Wheels Diesel:

"Can we do an apprenticeship?"

Answer:

- LRRGC is willing to sponsor apprentices in various programs, not just the Heavy-Duty Mechanic Program
- Apprentice positions should be applied for directly to the applicable Division be it Big Wheels for Mechanical, Heavy Equipment Operators in Caribou Mountain Construction and Carpenters, Electricians and Plumbers in Caribou Mountain Homes.
